500th Anniversary of the Reformation Approaches:

October 31, 1517 was the beginning of the public experience of what became the Lutheran/Protestant Reformation in Europe. That is the day Luther challenged for public debate just how we are to understand the forgiveness of sins for Christ's sake. What was to have been an academic matter among church leaders quickly burst into the open. This led to the lengthy and tension-filled process called the Reformation, one of the single most important events in the history of Europe and of the Christian Church.

Lots of events are marking this 500th anniversary. Here at St. Paul we're going to try to learn about and from that experience during October. During Bible class on October 8, 22, and 29, we are going to show the film "Luther" starring Joseph Fiennes. We'll divide this two-hour film giving time for questions and observations.
