Philippians 3:4b-12

If anyone else thinks he has reason for confidence in the flesh, I have more: ⁵circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; ⁶as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness, under the law blameless. ⁷But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. ⁸Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. WELCOME TO St. Paul’s Lutheran Church: We are glad that you are here as we gather around the Word and Sacraments of our Lord Jesus Christ. If you have not already done so, we ask that you would sign the guest book at the entrance to the church. If you do not have a church home and are interested in the teachings of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, or if you are interested in becoming a member here at St. Paul’s, please contact the church office.

The Sacrament of the Altar: In bread and wine of the Lord’s Supper, our Lord Jesus comes to us in His true Body & Blood. In this Holy Meal, one receives full forgiveness and perfect unity with each other. Scripture requires that each communicant first examine himself/herself regarding confession of sin, trust in Jesus for salvation, belief in the Real Presence, and the desire to grow in grace. We believe that Communion is a time when believers of like mind come close to the Lord and to one another. We do practice ‘close’ Communion, which means that all communicants believe as we do, and graciously receive this gift. If you are supportive of these beliefs, we welcome you to the Lord’s Supper. If, however, at this point you are unsure or question whether your beliefs differ from those of our church, we ask that you use the communion time to meditate and pray. For these reasons, it’s best for our new (first time) guests/visitors to talk briefly before the service with the pastor or an elder. A cup with white grape juice is located in the center of the communion tray for those who are allergic to alcohol. Gluten free wafers are available upon request.

PLEASE TAKE NOTE: After a great deal of research, discussion, consideration, and personal interviews, the Call Committee is recommending two specific candidates for voter consideration. As has been the case in the past all names submitted to the Call Committee are still open for consideration. There were five candidates on the Call Committee's short list, but three withdrew themselves from consideration for personal reasons. The Call Committee encourages all members to prayerfully consider the qualifications of these two Pastors and how they match our survey results and needs as we move toward our next call. The two candidates the Call Committee is setting forward are Rev. Robert Hoffman and Rev. Charles Kanefke. (Information is provided in alphabetical order by last name.) As in previous calls, the PIF's and SET's will be available in the church office and during Bible Class time. Since these are confidential information, they may not leave the church. The Call Committee is also providing additional information. Personal interviews were conducted with each Pastor. A pre-set list of questions was composed by the Call Committee. Then each candidate was asked the same questions, so it would be a "level playing field." At the end of the set list of questions the candidate was given the opportunity to ask questions and make comments. THESE INTERVIEWS WILL BE PLAYED DURING THE BIBLE CLASS TIME ON APRIL 14. There were technical difficulties with Pastor Kanefke's interview, so it will be audio only. However, we will have pictures of him available. Pastor Hoffman's interview will include both audio and video.
